

Subject—GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARING MINOR
IRRIGATION PROJECT

Great emphasis has been laid down by the Government on the construction of minor irrigation works mainly because such works being possible of early completion, would yield benefit comparatively early and thereby contribute in overcoming the food shortage in the State. Therefore this Department has been engaged in investigation, planning and construction of a large number of small sized irrigation projects all over the State.

2. It has, however, been noticed that varying practices and design methods are adopted by the local officers. With a view to have uniform practices and design methods, the accompanying technical note, broadly indicating the general instructions for preparing Minor Irrigation Projects has been prepared.

The Superintending Engineers of the Circles concerned are, therefore requested to instruct their subordinates to investigate, prepare and submit the Minor Irrigation Projects in accordance with the instructions in the accompanying technical note and to make sure that the projects, submitted by them hence forth, are complete in all respects.
